"PLASTIC PEOPLE" TO HAVE WORLD PREMIERE AT SXSW, DOCUMENTARY SPOTLIGHT SECTION

Award-winning documentary producer White Pine Pictures unveil a ground-breaking documentary on the perils of microplastics and human health.



Toronto, ON - January 10, 2024 - *Plastic People: The Hidden Crisis of Microplastics*, the feature documentary directed by Ben Addelman, is set to premiere at the SXSW Film Festival in the Spotlight Section on the opening weekend, March 8-10, 2024. The film's world premiere will shed light on humanity's intricate relationship with plastic and the alarming effects of microplastics on human health.

The groundbreaking investigative documentary delves into our societal addiction to plastic, uncovering the escalating threat posed by microplastics to the human body. Tracing the journey of microscopic plastic particles from their omnipresence in the environment to their recent discovery within human bodies—organs, blood, brain tissue, and even within the placentas of new mothers—the film raises critical questions about the repercussions of these unseen intruders on our health.

Ziya Tong, co-director and acclaimed author and science journalist, spearheads this investigative journey. In a deeply personal quest for answers, Tong travels the world visiting leading scientists and

experts searching for solutions, while at the same time participating in experiments conducted in her home, on her food, and in her body—all captured for the first time on camera. Some of the prominent global experts featured include: Dr. Pete Myers, Chief Scientist, Environmental Health Sciences, Virginia, U.S.A.; Dr. Jeanette Rotchell, Environmental Toxicologist, University of Hull, U.K.; and Dr. Sedat Gündoğdu, Microplastic Research Group, Cukurova University, Turkey,

An award-winning director of documentaries (Discordia, Nollywood Babylon, Bombay Calling, Kivalina vs Exxon) and TV series (Becoming You, Payday, Limitless), Ben Addelman remarked "Plastic People is an urgent wake-up call, unraveling the hidden crisis of our plastic-filled world and revealing how we got into this situation in the first place. The film will engage audiences in a crucial conversation about our health, our future, and the price we pay for our plastic addiction."

The SXSW world premiere screening at the Film & TV Festival will be accompanied by a separate 1-hour panel discussion in the SXSW Conference providing an in-depth exploration of the documentary's themes. Eight members of the production team will attend the world premiere, supported in part by Telefilm Canada. Plans for a Canadian theatrical release are set to occur in May, supported by a significant impact campaign managed by Good Measure Productions. The film will be screened on TELUS Communications' streaming platforms Spring of 2024.

"Plastic People" arrives at a crucial moment for the global debate on how to solve the plastic pollution issue. The United Nations is currently convening negotiations on a new global Plastics Treaty that is widely viewed as the most consequential environmental agreement since the Paris climate change accord.
